Part III Word Study

When you are reading, you will come across unfamiliar words. It is often possible to guess their meanings if you understand the way words in English are generally formed. An English word can be divided into three parts: a prefix, a root/base word, and a suffix. Pre means 'before.' A *PREFIX*, therefore, is what comes before the root/base word. A *SUFFIX* is attached to the end of the root/base word. Many times, a word can be defined when it is known what the prefix and suffix means. Prefixes usually change the meaning of the word. However, a suffix can change the meaning of the word; it can also form the part of speech.
